ACTIVITY 2: Point of View Pictures

Learning objective:

- ▶ This is all about taking the time to pause, and think about what someone else's point of view might be.
- ▶ When a child starts to notice other people's character strengths, it helps them to start understanding other points of view.

Learning approach:

To set up this activity we recommend that you print out the printables and template that we have provided. The printable includes two examples of situations that can be interpreted differently according to your point of view.

Your child can use the template to draw a situation that they have made up - remember, the purpose is to imagine a situation that is different, according to how you look at it. Why might the person or thing that you're looking at not be what we think at first?

Top tips:

- ▶ Younger children may need support in thinking up ideas. The imaginary situations you dream up don't need to be realistic ones - let your imaginations go wild!
